The 2024-2025 school year has begun! Where did the Summer

go? The Annual Registration Fee of \$175.00 has been billed to your account. Some of you might have already paid this fee, especially those who are newly enrolled. Also, those who may have entered into our center during the middle of our school year, your charges have been pro-rated. For our three and four year olds, and the new Two-Threes class, if you have not paid your curriculum fees (\$75, \$110, \$65), please do so.

The American Academy of Pediatrics...

Recommends:

- Infants and toddlers should ride in a rear-facing car safety seat as long as possible, until they reach the highest weight or height allowed by their seat. Most convertible seats have limits that will allow children to ride rear-facing for 2 years or more.
- Once they are facing forward, children should use a forward-facing car safety seat with a harness for as long as possible, until they reach the height and weight limits for their seats. Many seats can accommodate children up to 65 pounds or more.
- When children exceed these limits, they should use a belt-positioning booster seat until the vehicle's lap and shoulder seat belt fits properly. This is often when they have reached at least 4 feet 9 inches in height and are 8 to 12 years old.
- When children are old enough and large enough to use the vehicle seat belt alone, they should always use lap and shoulder seat belts for optimal protection.
- All children younger than 13 years should be restrained in the rear seats of vehicles for optimal protection. State Laws – http://www.iihs.org/iihs/topics/laws/safetybeltuse?topicName=childsafety

September Snack Recipe:

Banana Dogs

- * 2 Tortillas (any variety will
- * ¼ cup peanut butter, almond butter, or any other nut butter
- * 2 bananas, peeled
- 1. Place 1 tortilla on a flat surface and spread 2 tablespoons of peanut butter on the tortilla to coat it evenly.
- 2. Place one whole banana near the edge of the tortilla and roll it up.
- 3. Slice the banana dog into ½-inch rounds.
- 4. Repeat to make a second banana dog and serve.

Note: If your tortillas are stiff, you can put them in the microwave between 2 pieces of moist paper towel and heat for 15 to 20 seconds, or until softened.
